The challenge of finding the right

Find Selection Look Up Edward Hugh Simpson, a statistician and former cryptanalyst at Bletchley Park, described the statistical phenomenon that takes his name in a technical paper in 1951. Simpson's paradox highlights one of my favourite things about data: the need for good intuition regarding the real world and how most data is a finite dimensional representation of a much larger, much more complex domain. The art of data science is seeing beyond the data — using and developing methods and tools to get an idea of what that hidden reality looks like. Simpson's paradox showcases the importance of skepticism and interpreting data with respect to the real world, and also the dangers of oversimplifying a more complex truth by trying to see the whole story from a single data-viewpoint.







Multiple color-coded calendars



How to CREATE & SHARE a Photo Library (iPhone)

Create a Shared Library

To set up a Shared Library, you need a device with iOS 16.1, iPadOS 16.1, or macOS Ventura or later with iCloud Photos turned on. If you're under 13, you can only join or create a Shared Library with members of your Family Sharing group.*

On your iPhone or iPad


- 1. Go to Settings > Photos, then tap Shared Library.
- 2. Choose up to five people to invite, or you can invite participants later.
- Choose past photos and videos that you want to move to your Shared Library, or choose to move photos later.
- Follow the onscreen steps to preview your Shared Library, confirm the content that you want to share, and invite additional participants.



*but beware if you have older computers or devices...

How to JOIN another's Photo Library


- 1. Open the invitation from the library creator or go to Settings > Photos.
- 2. Tap Accept & Continue.
- 3. Follow the onscreen steps to choose photos and videos you want to move to your Shared Library, or choose to move photos later.
- 4. Follow the onscreen steps to preview your Shared Library content and confirm the content that you want to share.




...then whatever's been shared with you will appear in "shared".

Shared BY me vs shared WITH me...

Sharer can move between Personal and Shared...






...sharee can only choose to copy to their Personal library.

HERE'S THE CAVEAT!

- 1. Pre-iOS 16 devices' Photos app won't work!
- 2. Pre-macOS Ventura Macs Photos app won't work!
- 3. Work-around www.icloud.com in Safari
